SO IT'S UP TO YOU.**

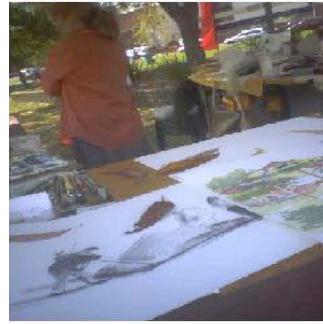
Did you attend any of the events at Viva La Gong?
